Follow these four easy steps to host your own Book Club:

- Decide the Basics**
 - Do you want to meet in person or virtually?
 - Who is your group for (artists, board members, coworkers, marketing staff, your friend group, anyone, etc.)?
 - What day and time works best for you? You can do it in the lead-up to Alex Sarian's appearance on October 28th or as a response after the event.

- Fill out the TACA Survey** so we can list your group on our website (even if it is a closed conversation). We can even help recruit members if you would like, just let us know in the survey.

- Review the Discussion Guide** provided by TACA before your scheduled Book Club. Feel free to use all, some, or none of these questions. You can share the Discussion Guide with everyone in advance to get their thoughts flowing.

- Invite your Participants** by organizing a list of who should be in attendance, and send a reminder of the Book Club meeting 24 hours in advance.

If you are hosting an event open to new participants, we recommend that you arrive a little early (15 minutes) to welcome your members as they come. Then let the conversation flow and enjoy!
